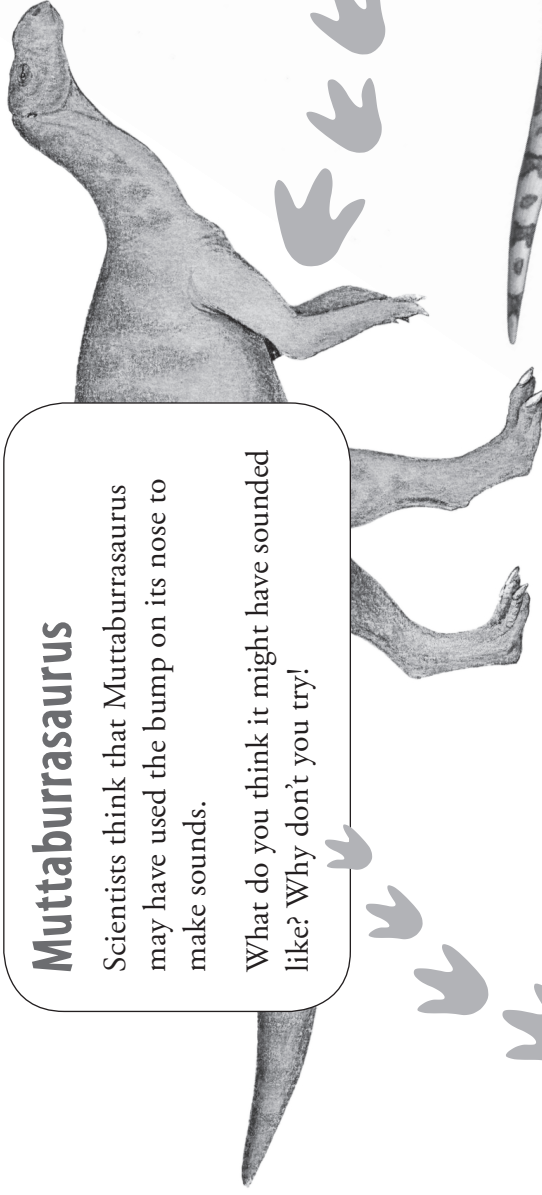


Muttaburrasaurus

Look out! Giganotosaurus was the largest meat eater of all – even larger than T. rex. But there were small meat eaters too. Can you find one?



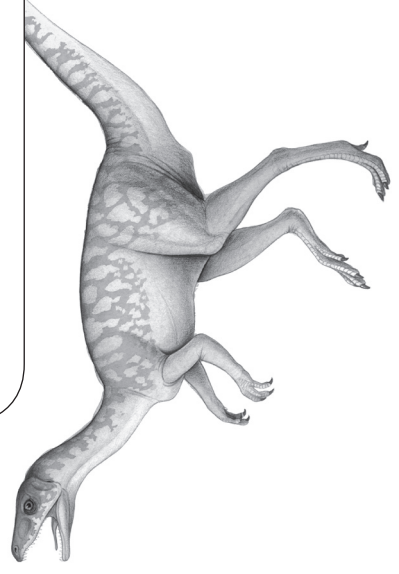
Life on the edge – Lightning Ridge

Dinosaurs shared the world with lots of different animals and so do we. Can you find any prehistoric creatures which are still alive now?

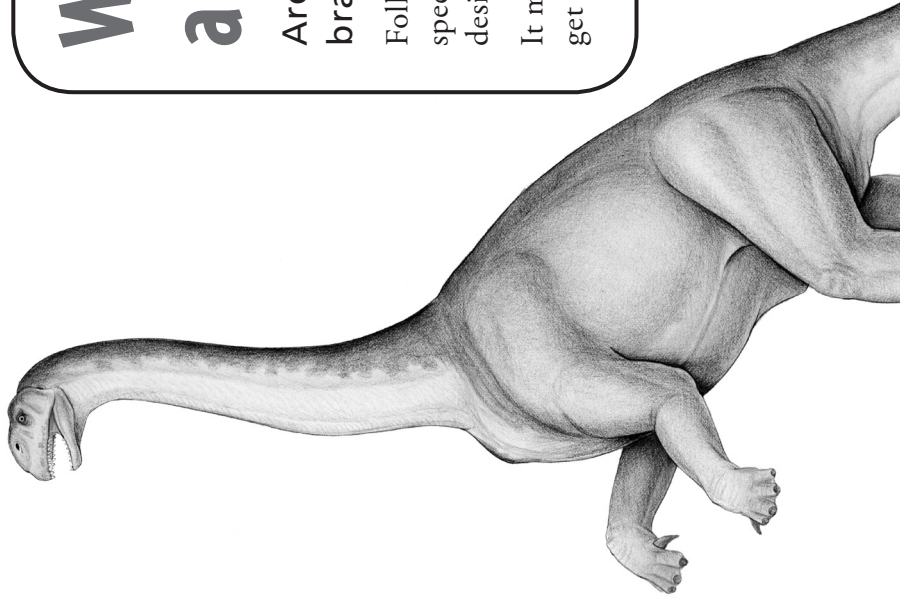


Life cycles
